Programme overview

The Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA) is one of the most important and complex pieces of legislation that local government is required to implement within communities. Elected members cannot avoid coming into contact with the RMA, whether they are accredited decision makers or not. This interactive course has been designed to be an informative and invigorating session for elected members of all ranges of experience, from first termers, through to Accredited RMA commissioners.

From resource consents to plan making and variations, enforcement issues and complaints, gaining confidence around the RMA is one of the most important tools you can have.

- › how and where it touches elected members directly;
- › resource consents, plan changes, notification, the permitted baseline;
- › how to respond appropriately to residents with RMA queries;
- › the difference between your role as an elected member and a quasi-judicial decision maker;
- › basic terminology and traps for young players; and
- › difficulties, war stories, and tricks of the trade.
